A land of heritage and memory... Lyons Andelle has always endeavoured to conserve and preserve the heritage that has shaped its identity. From cotton spinning works and mills to abbeys and local legends, this heritage is what gives Lyons-Andelle its authentic character. A strong heritage from which the region draws a strong identity. On guided tours, at events or simply when you make unexpected discoveries, take some time to stop at these places. They are steeped in history, and will leave a lasting impression on you.

A MEDIEVAL LAND

Lyons Andelle continues to bring the past to life by celebrating its heritage. Every year, the Mortemer Abbey and the Notre-Dame de Fontaine-Guérard Abbey each organise a Medieval Festival. Immerse yourself in a weekend of history. Sword fights, demonstrations of time-honoured skills, re-enactment camps, medieval costumes... Time, which seems to stand still in places like these, finally resumes its course when these events take place. For dates, see pages 20 and 21.

LOCAL LEGENDS

At dawn, when slumbering villages are still draped in mist, Lyons Andelle is cloaked in a mystical atmosphere all of its own. Here, between the valleys and forests, some places hide some extraordinary legends...

Although time seems to stand still at Mortemer Abbey, its legends are still alive and well. The most famous one is known even beyond our borders. But whose legend is it? Empress Mathilde, also known as The White Lady, granddaughter of William the Conqueror and grandmother of Richard the Lionheart. Some say they have glimpsed her during their visit, wearing her black gloves, said to foretell bad things to come.

It is also said that the spirits of the Benedictine monks murdered during the French Revolution wander through the cellars of the house to drink wine that tastes of blood. So keep an eye open for stealthy shadows and muffled sounds; you may not be alone during your visit.

Other legends take us to Andelle and the Côte des Deux Amants (Two Lovers' Hill). The most romantic legend is that of Raoul and Mathilde. Raoul de Bonnemare was in love with Mathilde, a noble young woman, the daughter of Lord Robert, the Baron de Canteloup. The baron agreed to give his daughter's hand to Raoul, but only if he was able to climb a daunting hill while carrying his wife-to-be on his back.

Raoul, madly in love with his beautiful lady, accepted and took up the challenge, but it cost him his life, and his sweetheart was consumed by grief at the loss of her love. And to this day, the path in the Valley and the Edmond and Caliste route will take you up to the climax of this legend. A unique panoramic view over the Valley awaits you!

There are other legends about love. Like the trees at Fontaine-Guérard. A pine tree and a chestnut tree entwined together at the heart of this Cistercian abbey's gardens are said to be the symbol of eternal love.

LYONS ANDELLE AND ITS BEAUTIFUL ABANDONED RUINS

Life has always flourished along the meandering banks of the Andelle, shaping a landscape of châteaux, fortifications, abbeys, and thriving industries, from mills to cotton spinning works. As you go out and explore Lyons Andelle, you'll quickly notice how its industrial heritage reflects the golden age that brought prosperity to several of its towns.

The most iconic among the 30 textile mills scattered throughout the region is the former Levavasseur mill, standing proudly between Pont-Saint-Pierre, Radepont and Douville-sur-Andelle. This architectural gem, built in the English neo-Gothic style by Baron Charles Levavasseur, today lies in ruins, a historical relic nestling in the heart of nature.









LYONS-LA-FORÊT, BETWEEN AUTHENTICITY AND IDLENESS

Lyons-la-Forêt is a timeless oasis set in the middle of a 10,700-hectare forest.

Here, in this ancient Gallo-Roman village, everything is beautiful... calm and full of delight, as Baudelaire might have added. So it is only right that since 1996, this small Norman village of 700 souls has been recognised as one of the most beautiful villages, the "Plus Beaux Villages de France".

To enjoy visiting Lyons-la-Forêt, you need to...

Lose yourself in its ancient streets with their Norman charm.

Look up and admire the 17th-century brick and half-timbered houses.

Get off the beaten track and explore the Lieure, Venture behind the facades to discover its antique shops, charming hotels and restaurants with their myriad flavours.

Take your time to appreciate the gentle lifestyle that reigns supreme in the village.

In short, in Lyons-la-Forêt, you must live for the present and take the time to enjoy the moment.

The covered market

More than a central building, Lyons-la-Forêt's Halle, or covered market is part of the village's identity. Over 13 metres high and 23 metres long, the covered market is a construction 100% *made in* the Lyons forest. Its oak pillars and chestnut wood frame were taken directly from the neighbouring forest in the 17th century.

The village has come to life under the listed covered market hall since time immemorial, especially on market days. In the past, you would find textiles, horse saddles and even animals there, but today it is a more traditional market that awaits you on Thursday, Saturday and Sunday mornings. However, the covered market was witness to a somewhat different market in 1991 when *Madame Bovary* was shot by Claude Chabrol.

The market takes on a new look during the flower festival every June... That of the long-awaited summer.

The Bailiwick room*

Push open the door of the Lyons-la-Forêt town hall, climb the few period steps and discover the Bailwick room. This is where conflicts were heard to resolve property disputes, judge misdemeanours or settle issues with taxes.

Today, the Bailiwick room, registered as a historical monument, welcomes happier events, like weddings. But past memories of this place, dating back to the Old Regime, still remain today. Like this fleur-de-lys hanging restored in 1830, this painting by Isaac de Benserade, a member of the French Academy who taught the authors Racine, La Fontaine and Corneille, and even these wooden chairs bearing the effigy of Saint Denis, the patron saint of Lyons-la-Forêt.

The three mills

At the crossroads of Rue du Bout de Bas and Rue de la Rouge Mare, wander down to the banks of the Lieure and enjoy the Square des Bénédictines, also named Square des Trois Moulins, the square of the three mills.

Under the shade of the weeping willows, in a bucolic (even romantic) environment, it's hard to imagine that three royal mills stood here in the 14th century, and used to grind the wheat and oat grains stored in the covered market's attic. A few centuries later, in 1894, these mills provided the village with electricity.

Follow the gentle sound of the waterfall, approach the river and you may see a glimpse of the ruins of one of them.

Lyons Andelle green Renowned for its tall trees, which give it a 'cathedral-like' appearance, the Lyons Forest is the largest beech forest in France and one of the largest in Europe. It is also the largest forest in Normandy. THE LYONS NATIONAL FOREST

In spring, the forest is carpeted with thousands and thousands of bluebells. In summer, it is a pure green, refreshing the hottest days with its lush, verdant colour. In autumn, it warms us with its golden colours. In winter, it offers us the pleasure of walking with the sound of rustling leaves underfoot.











Arboretum

Iso known as the "Jardin orestier des Bordins", the Arboretum your invitation to discover over one undred species of trees from all over ne world. Treat yourself to a trip to a inique 8-hectare site, taking between 0 minutes and 1 hour 30 minutes to xplore.

Remarkable trees

The trees are remarkable for their size, which is due to their age, and for their strange shapes, caused by climatic conditions, genetic variability or human interference.

Remarkable trees can be found here and there throughout the Lyons

National Forest. The Lyons Andelle

Tourist Office will tell you where to find them.

Royal Forest

Once a royal forest prized by the kings of France and the dukes of Normandy, the Lyons National Forest is home to some remarkable wildlife. Keep your eyes open for deer, roe deer, wild boar, as well as badgers, squirrels and foxes.



FRIDAY

Start your stay in the morning at the **Notre-Dame de Fontaine Guérard Abbey**, where the atmosphere is timeless. This historic abbey was founded in 1190 and is a superb example of Anglo-Norman gothic architecture.

It is also a mystical place with its miraculous spring, not far from an intertwined pine and chestnut tree, symbols of a Norman legend known as the 'Two Lovers'. Less than 100 m from the abbey, a photo stop is a must in front of the *Filature Levavasseur*. The ruins of this industrial structure, a spinning mill designed on the plan of a 19th-century Gothic cathedral, are unique in Europe.

Head to the *L'Évidence restaurant in Romilly-sur- Andelle* for lunch. It has been awarded the 'Trophée Accueil 2025' (Welcome trophy) by the Gault et Millau guide. Give your taste buds a treat at this gourmet restaurant with its subtle and flavoursome cuisine! Booking is strongly recommended.

Continue your day in the beautiful countryside. You can explore Normandy's largest national forest on an 11 km hike: the Jacassière loop. The start and car park are next to the church in Touffreville, where you'll have a nice panoramic view over the village.

If you're less sporty and more hands-on, you can enjoy a woodworking workshop with Mag Palette in Romilly-sur-Andelle, an introduction to pottery with Flopy Céramique in Radepont, or knife-making workshops with our local blacksmiths (see page 35).

To end the day, visit the magnificent *Château de Bonnemare*, a living monument to the 16th century, where you can stay in one of the five guest rooms and take a trip through the centuries.

Finally, for a festive start to the evening, especially in summer, come and enjoy a warm and friendly welcome at the *Guinguette Insulaire*. Experience the guinguette spirit by sampling the beer produced on site by the *Brasserie Insulaire* on the banks of the Andelle, Plenty of other products are available to liven up your dancing and your games of petanque or darts!














SATURDAY

Arrive in the morning at Lyons-la-Forêt, which is classified under the "Plus Beaux Villages de France", "Fleur d'Or" and "Villes et Villages Fleuris" labels. Make the most of the market in the centuries-old covered market hall. Local producers offer fresh seasonal produce direct from the farm and local neighbourhood.

If you prefer heritage and history, a tour of Lyons-la-Forêt will take you back in time and introduce you to the mysteries of this village.*

As you stroll through the narrow streets of Lyons-la-Forêt, you'll be charmed by its historic monuments and medieval timber-framed houses, as well as its antique and bric-a-brac shops and talented artists' studios offering individual or small group painting lessons.

At lunchtime, there are several places to choose from in the centre of the village: *Le restaurant de la Halle, Le Café du Commerce, Le Petit Lyons, Le Bistro du Grand Cerf, and Le Lounge du Grand Cerf...* and for an unforgettable culinary experience, with 1* in the Michelin Guide, choose *La Licorne Royale*, run by chef Christophe Poirier. As this is a popular destination, we advise you to book in advance.

In the afternoon, go explore the area. Head for the *Château de Vascoeuil* and its museum dedicated to Jules Michelet. The château's garden is an open-air museum; lined with superb sculptures by the greatest names in contemporary art, including Braque, Cocteau, Dali and Vazarely. The château is situated in a splendid 5-hectare park and is also home to an exhibition devoted this year to visionary art, from 12 April to 26 October 2025, with the presentation of part of the collection of artist photographer Hervé Serane. In season, "La Cascade" in the château garden offers sweet and savoury local treats.

Continue your exploration going bargain-hunting at *Dumont Antiquité* in Mainneville then travel on to take in the *Festival Photos de Martagny* from 15 June to 31 August 2025 or continue shopping for antiques and curios at *Madame Sortie d'Usine* in Morgny.

Then pause at the *Vignes Normandes* to enjoy a drink in a former school that has been converted into a cellar and restaurant, where you can sample local specialities and appetiser platters.

SUNDAY

Head into the forest for a bike ride. Enjoy a breath of fresh air in the forest. *Loc E Vélo* offers mountain bikes or electrically assisted bicycles for hire. Visit the magnificent Lyons National Forest with minimal effort and without getting lost using GPS with built-in forest and tourist trails to follow.

Our 17 hiking trails, ranging from 4 to 24 km, are designed for you to enjoy the peace and quiet of the countryside and the many sites you can visit, depending on your route. You can follow them on your own or with professional guides (contact the Lyons Andelle Tourist Office).

If you'd like to take to the water, **Sportydev** offers kayak outings on the Andelle in fine weather.

If you'd rather relax and be pampered, head to the *Spa de la Licorne* in Lyons-la-Forêt. There, you can enjoy an indoor and outdoor swimming pool, a hammam, a sauna and massages in a cabin up in the tree tops.

If you're looking for a spellbinding family experience, don't miss the sublime *Mortemer Abbey* and its surrounding park, which have hidden many mysteries in its 900 years...

To finish off, enjoy a delicious lunch at **Restaurant l'Unique** in **Ménesqueville**, which will satisfy your appetite and tantalise your palate with expertly cooked local and seasonal produce.

It is a place of wonder, set on the banks of the River Andelle. Notre-Dame de Fontaine-Guérard Abbey is one of the must-see places in Lyons Andelle. Its architecture never fails to impress, least of all its owner, Olivier Monpoint. It was love at first sight when this native of Burgundy left his home region to bring this place steeped in history back to life. With its symbolic gardens and miraculous spring, experience the magic of the Notre-Dame de Fontaine-Guérard Abbey.

Notre-Dame de Fontaine-Guérard Abbey is known as a place that "heals". Tell us all about it!

The origin of the spring goes back to the Gauls, who diverted small underground streams to create a resurgent spring because this place, due to its unique energies, was a Druidic site. As a result, there has always been a spirituality about the abbey. "Fontaine" means spring, and "Guérard" means healer. Every year, people come to draw water from the spring to treat their ailments and testify to its benefits because this water has dermatological properties.

An abbey brought back to life in the heart of a 3-hectare park. What makes it so special?

There are four gardens to explore at the rear of the abbey. "Le Jardin des Simples": this garden, located in the former infirmary, contains medicinal plants. The garden of the four elements; the garden of meditation, and the garden of quintessence.

The latter was built just over a year ago with the help of a geobiologist who probed the energies of the ground to create a spiral with a central point of elevation that makes the link between the earth and the sky.

A heritage worth discovering in every season, with its unmissable highlights!

If you're interested in spirituality without any sense of a dogmatic approach, the Book and Spirituality Fair, held every year on the 1^{er} May, is a highlight, with high-quality talks open to all and a meditation workshop in the morning. Then, in honour of our Viking homeland, we hold the Médiévales Festival every 1^{er} weekend in June. Last but not least, the creators, arts and crafts show, the "Salon des Créateurs et des Métiers d'Art", ends the tourist season on a high on the last weekend in October.


What do you like most about the region?

Get on your bike and set off to explore the Eure legends trail. This 70 km greenway links the Norman Vexin to Poses via Lisors, Charleval, Lyons-la-Forêt and the Andelle Valley.



THE TREASURE OF THE TEMPLARS OF GISORS

Start your visit to Gisors with a tour of its château, where legend has it that a treasure trove of gold coins lies beneath the château mound... Then take one of the most beautiful greenways in the Eure to Lyons Andelle.



THE LEGEND OF THE TOWN OF CHARLEVAL

Pedal a little further, and you will find yourself between the forest and the river at Charleval. Here, too, a legend circulates... That of King Charles IX, who is said to have seen a will-o'-the-wisp while hunting in the Lyons National Forest. Following this appearance, the king ordered the construction of the largest residence ever to exist in France. Now, the town's name is all that remains of this project.



THE LEGEND OF THE TWO LOVERS

Finish your cycling tour with the legend of the two lovers and a climb up the hill of the same name, which you can reach from Romilly-sur-Andelle. This is where, in the 12th century, young Raoul had to carry his beloved Mathilde to win her hand in marriage. At the top of the hill, Raoul died of exhaustion, and Mathilde, in despair, threw herself into the void. But legend aside, what awaits you is, above all, a unique panorama of the Seine valley with a view of Poses below, your point of arrival.



LISORS AND MORTEMER ABBEY

Continue along the route of legends to one of the most famous, that of Mortemer Abbey. Located in Lisors, it is said to be haunted by the ghost of Mathilde, who was once locked up in the abbey in an attempt to tame her. Take advantage of your stopover to learn about the history of this magical and mystical place, founded in the 12th century by Henry Ist Beauclerc, Duke of Normandy and King of England.



THE CURSED SPINNING MILL AND THE HEALING FOUNTAIN

Continue along the Voie des Légendes to the village of Radepont and explore Fontaine-Guérard Abbey, a former Cistercian abbey dating from the 12th century where time seems to have come to a standstill. Here, there flows a miraculous spring that is said to cure skin problems. Just a few metres away, stop in front of the incredible Filature Levavasseur. Located alongside the Andelle, this former industrial cathedral, unique in Europe, is a magical place that has long been the victim of curses, having suffered three fires. It is no less dazzling from the inside when you visit than it is from the banks of the Andelle.



There are plenty of treasures to be found in Lyons Andelle, but this is one of the greatest. In the heart of the village of Lyons-la-Forêt, the restaurant *La Licorne Royale* is waiting to treat you to a unique dining experience. And it's all down to chef Christophe Poirier and his brigade. Christophe, a Michelin-starred chef since 2014 and winner of the Prosper Montagné award in 2015, brings out the best of the region in his dishes. Every season brings new inspiration. We followed him into his kitchen one autumn morning so he could share a recipe made in Lyons-Andelle for you to make at home.

Supreme of free-range chicken flavoured with cinnamon and orange butter

(Recipe serves 4)

Ingredients:

- 4 free-range chicken breasts
- 300 g sliced button mushrooms
- 2 large carrots, finely chopped
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 small cinnamon sticks
- 1 glass of orange juice
- 1 water glass of chicken stock
- 100 g butter, halved
- salt and pepper

Stir-fry meat in 50 g of butter. Season them first.

Start cooking them skin side down in a sauté pan. Once browned, turn the pieces over and sweat lightly. Put them to one side.

To the same pan, add the chopped onion and carrots. Sweat those again. Add the sliced mushrooms and cinnamon sticks. Place the chicken on top of the mixture. Deglaze the pan with the orange juice and stock. Cover and cook for 15 minutes over a low heat.

Sauce

Remove the chicken breasts and leave them to rest under aluminium foil, then add the vegetable garnish, keeping the cooking juices in the sauté pan with the cinnamon. Whisk the sauce with the remaining 50 g of butter and the cooking juices.

Adjust the seasoning if necessary.

Dressing the plate

Place the garnish on the plate. Carve the chicken breasts to your liking, then drizzle the sauce over them.

In the Andelle Valley, there is a craftswoman who works in an enchanting world. Her name is Floriane Dudemaine-Fournol, aka Flopy Céramique. An artist and creative at heart, she embarked on a new life that resonates with her whole being four years ago. After training at the Pôle Céramique Normandie, Floriane opened her workshop in her home in Radepont. She has an obvious need to tell stories and convey beauty, and this is reflected in this artist's work. We met her in her studio, nestled in the green and unspoilt haven of the valley.

Tell us about the world of Flopy Céramique!

I create decorative objects and sculptures that bring a touch of imagination and poetry, taking a step aside from our reality. I like to think that my creations will decorate people's homes, bringing the imaginary into our everyday lives.

Where do you find your inspiration?

My work is inspired by fairy tales, fables and the literary imagination, with all the symbolism of personified animals. In particular, I like to represent different types of readers in my work. The postures and intensity of the reading convey the sense of escape and the absorbing intimacy of reading.

Where can I come and see you?

You can meet me directly at the workshop.

I welcome appointments so I can be 100% available. It's an opportunity to discover the breadth of my work.

I exhibit the pieces I create at the Arts du feu gallery at the Aître Saint-Maclou in Rouen and at the Maison des Métiers d'Arts at the McArthurGlen centre in Giverny-Douains, both of which showcase Norman arts and crafts.

I attend designer fairs and markets in Lyons Andelle, Notre-Dame de Fontaine-Guérard Abbey, Lyons-la-Forêt, and also all over Normandy and the Paris region. You can meet me through my courses. Just check my website and social networks for the dates. I also do some online sales.

What are your favourite places in the Lyons Andelle region?

I'm very fond of *Forges de l'Andelle* and *l'Ombre et la Flamme*, my blacksmith friends. You'll find them at craft fairs, too. And then there's the *Guinguette Insulaire* in Charleval. It's very lively there, a convivial place to meet. My family and I live in the valley, and we're very attached to the place. It's open from April to October.

Explore as a family

Sentier de la Fontaineresse • 6,5 km Start: La Poste parking area, Lyons-la-Forêt

Explore Lyons-la-Forêt and its surroundings in the beautiful countryside. This family hike offers new views of one of the Most Beautiful Villages of France.



For mountain biking enthusiasts

Saint-Mathurin loop • 6.5 km Start: Place de l'église in Les Hogues

The walk begins with a unique panoramic view of the Andelle Valley. Then, listen to the legends of Saint-Mathurin before continuing on to the Lyons National Forest, where Gallo-Roman remains lie hidden.



For all-terrain hikers

Bois de Bacqueville • 24 km Start: festival hall, Radepont

Charleval, Fleury-sur-Andelle, Val d'Orger, Ménesqueville, Radepont, Rosay-sur-Lieure, Vandrimare, it is the longest hike in the region. It can be completed on foot or mountain bike.



For Sunday walkers

Sentier de la Fontaine Bulant • 8,5 km Start: cemetery parking area, Charleval

This hike, between the valley and the forest, is the ideal way to get away from it all in the depths of the countryside. In spring, you can admire the carpets of wild hyacinths, the purple bluebells that give the forest a unique appearance.

Sentier du Bois de Bonnemare • 10 km Start: festival hall, Radepont

This energetic hike will take you to some of the most beautiful spots in the Forêt de Lyons, including Mortemer Abbey and the arboretum in Lyons. A trail that lets you discover the history of the region in the heart of the countryside.

Go on a "clean walk"






